"THE BIG FOUR" CRIMINOGENIC NEEDS

Criminogenic Need	Response
Anti-social cognition	Reduce anti-social cognition, recognize risky thinking and feelings, adopt an alternative identity
Anti-social companions	Reduce association with offenders, enhance contact with pro-social
Anti-social personality or temperament	Build problem solving, self-management, anger management, and coping skills
Family and/or marital	Reduce conflict, build positive relationships and communication, enhance monitoring/supervision

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PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

RESIDENTIAL PROGRAMS:

Community and Residential Programs (CRP) – The program provides residential care, service coordination and step down non-residential program services to offenders. The licensing of the facility is based on the specific program needs within the contract.

Halfway House Program (HWH) – This program includes a community based residential facility licensed under HFS83 Wisconsin Administrative Code to provide 24/7 supervision with secular group and individual treatment service to individuals who have been referred for residential care.

Three Quarterway House Program – Housing is provided in the form of one to two bedroom apartment(s) or a facility with multiple single or double occupancy bedrooms with access to a congregate living areas and shared kitchen. The contractor supplies all bedding, household supplies (dishes, cooling utensils, alarm clock, etc.), a food supply for one week, and staff providing supervision via random on-site inspections. Offenders have rules that must be followed, program services to be attended, and employment requirements.

This differs from the typical Transitional Living Program as participation in program groups, that is required as a part of this program, are provided off-site. Program groups address both Life Skills (curriculum includes practical skills and emotional IQ/learning skills for success) and Parenting Education.

Transitional Living Program (TLP) – Housing is provided in the form of one to two bedroom apartment(s) or a facility with multiple single or double occupancy bedrooms with access to a congregate living areas and shared kitchen. The contractor supplies all bedding, household supplies (dishes, cooling utensils, alarm clock, etc.), a food supply for one week, and staff providing supervision via random on-site inspections. Offenders have rules that must be followed, program services to be attended as determined by their agent and employment requirements.

NON-RESIDENTIAL PROGRAMS:

Anger Management with Impulse Control – Program services provide group intervention to assist offenders in increasing their ability to deal with anger appropriately in order to reduce the number of repeated contacts with the criminal justice system for this reason.

Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT) – Cognitive interventions is defined as a program which teaches specific strategies or techniques to enable offenders to (1) identify for themselves the specific thoughts that support their criminal behavior (self-observation); (2) see and appreciate the pattern and consequences of their thinking; (3) utilize reasoning and problem solving, self-talk, social interaction skills as a means of controlling and changing their thinking; (4) recognize that they have choices and can make a conscious decision to change or not to change. This includes Cognitive Skills and Cognitive Restructuring.

Day Report Center (DRC) – The programming of the DRC is multi-disciplinary holistic approach to treatment, education and employment services in a single location. The primary therapeutic goal of the DRC is to assist offenders in achieving a responsible, crime-free lifestyle by addressing their criminogenic needs.

Domestic Violence (DV) – The concept that includes the entire spectrum of coercive control and battering exercised by a former or current intimate or dating partner over another (physical assaults, sexual assaults, emotional abuse, verbal abuse, isolation, economic abuse, threats, stalking and intimidation). Domestic violence is known as partner abuse, spouse abuse, intimate partner violence or battering, and can be characterized as a pattern of coercive behaviors that may include physical injury, progressive social isolation, deprivation, and intimidation. This includes Domestic Violence Education.

Emergency/Supplemental Housing – Emergency is temporary, thirty day housing offered to offenders who have no appropriate residence and may be waiting for a residential program opening. This is generally a hotel room, cottage or perhaps a small furnished apartment. Supplemental is temporary support of offender leased housing where DCC pays part or all of a few months' rent. Payment is made directly to the landlord on behalf of the offender.

Employment, Vocational and Community Services – Vocational assessments, work adjustment training; pre-employment/job search training, job development/placement services, and education services are provided to offenders so that they may find gainful employment in the community. Community Services provide monitoring of offenders that are working for non-profit agencies in the community to complete community service court ordered obligations.

Family Reintegration Services – The Family Connections Program is offered in Milwaukee only. The program enhances an offenders' ability to maintain significant relationships. Although there are situations where families are better off without a neglectful or abusive parent or partner in their lives, there are many caring and committed incarcerated mothers and fathers who expect to resume their parenting role upon release. Strengthening those connections during incarceration and point of reentry will ultimately assist families, offenders and the community.

Pre-Treatment Program – The program introduces offenders to the basic cognitive programming tools with the intent to reduce barriers prohibiting successful program participation. The curriculum is developed to teach offenders how to manage attitudes, thoughts, feelings and emotions responsibly. This is a prelude to receiving any other group services.

Psychological Services – This program provides general psychological services including identification and treatment of mental health conditions that may prevent an offender from maintaining a pro-social lifestyle.

Sex Offender Services – Program services address the rehabilitation need of offenders convicted of sex offenses. Program components address denial focus to address the offender's failure to accept responsibility for behavior, cognitive interventions and relapse profile which identifies factors in the offender's environment and lifestyle, behavior, things, beliefs, attitudes, arousal and fantasy which predispose the offender to criminal sexual behavior.

Substance Abuse (Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse) – Services include group and/or individual community based treatment for offenders to promote abstinence from mood altering chemicals and make lifestyle changes to avoid further legal difficulties. This includes Assessments, Intensive Outpatient groups, Aftercare or Continuing Care, and Relapse Intervention/Prevention.

Wisconsin Fresh Start Program – The purpose of the program is to provide at-risk young people with education, employment skills, and career direction leading to economic self-sufficiency. This is accomplished through opportunities for meaningful service in their communities by helping to meet the housing needs of low-income individuals and families. The program is managed through the Wis. Department of Administration and designed to provide on-site housing construction and rehabilitation work experience, off-site academic classes, and supportive services for young people - primarily high school dropouts - aged 16 to 24.

NOTE: Target Population -

Each program serves offenders who have been convicted in adult court and are under DOC supervision for the duration of services. Factors considered in referrals include convicting offense behavior(s), prior record, other prior history, indicators of imminent relapse, availability of resources, or other case contingencies. Priority placement is given to moderate to high risk offenders based upon COMPAS/DOC screening.

Some offenders have identified special needs, such as learning disabilities/cognitive limitations. Learning styles and needs are reasonably accommodated in the program.

DEFINITIONS

DEFINITIONS:

Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse (AODA) Definitions:

The below listing is not inclusive of all definitions as defined in Wisconsin Administrative Code DHS 75. Other definitions as referenced in DHS 75 for Community Substance Abuse Service Standards are applicable. Additional information at <http://legis.wisconsin.gov/rsb/code/dhs/dhs030.html>

Intensive Outpatient: A structured, non-residential AODA treatment consisting of regularly scheduled sessions of various treatment modalities such as counseling case management, group or individual therapy, medical services, and mental health services, as indicated, by interdisciplinary contractors for a scheduled number of sessions per day and week. This is the most intensive level of outpatient counseling.

Relapse Intervention/Prevention: AODA treatment to which an offender is referred due to exhibiting signs of relapse/destabilization. The goal of such a “booster” form of treatment is to re-stabilize and return the offender to community living following a structured re-exposure to program elements designed to address the issues the offender was having difficulty within the community. Typically, this might occur through an alternative to revocation process with the needed elements identified in the treatment plan. Relapse Prevention can also be combined with Outpatient AODA Counseling as elements of an individual treatment plan.

Aftercare or Continuing Care: Aftercare and Continuing Care are interchangeable terms and refer to treatment provided after the offender has completed the goals of a primary care program and no longer requires counseling at that intensity level. Aftercare is less intensive treatment that tapers the treatment process in order to sustain and extend the offender’s recovery by reinforcing the concepts learned in the primary program. Aftercare is usually offered on an outpatient basis for a limited time

Alternative To Revocation (ATR): A written and signed agreement between DOC and the offender.

Assessment: The process of collecting and analyzing information about an offender so that appropriate decisions can be made regarding sentencing, supervision, and treatment. Assessments may include the following types:

AODA Assessment: The process and procedures by which a counselor or service identifies and evaluates an individual’s strengths, weaknesses, problems and needs in order to develop the offender’s individual treatment plan or to make recommendations for the offender’s continuing care per Wisconsin Uniform Placement Criteria (UPC).

Sex Offender Assessment: Identifies specific problem areas, strengths and weaknesses, skills, knowledge, and the precedents and antecedents of the sexually abusive behavior. Recommendations for the appropriate type of intervention and level of need for treatment must be included. It also includes a completed Sex Offender Assessment Report (DOC-1577)

Intake Assessment: Determines and documents problem areas to be addressed in the program and the offender’s appropriateness for the program. The intake assessment includes the initial Treatment assessment, Criminal Complaint, Judgment of Conviction, Agent’s Assessment and Impressions, and offender interview to determine and report appropriateness and level of group services to be provided.

The treatment plan includes measurable goals and objectives, as well as activities/services needed to achieve successful discharge.

Bed Day: One residential program slot for one offender per 24-hour day that is continuously available to DOC.

Discharge Summary: Documents a summary of treatment progress when the offender completes or is terminated from a program. The discharge summary includes recommendations for further treatment as well as recommendations to assist the agent in supervising the offender. It also includes a completed Sex Offender Program Report (DOC-1423).

Case Plan: Process by which the contractor, supervising agent and offender identify problems needing resolution, establish agreed-upon immediate, short-term and long-term goals and decide on programming to be utilized based on the severity of the offender's presenting problems

Clinical Supervision: Management of the treatment aspects of the program. Tasks and responsibilities include development, implementation, and functional oversight of programs; maintaining current knowledge of research, literature, evidence based practices, program theories and models relevant to target populations served by the program; ensuring ethical and professional standards are maintained in program delivery.

It also requires the periodic direct observation and analytic review of ongoing assessment, counseling, motivational interviewing, treatment plan development, implementation, discharge planning and case management by the contractor staff with the purpose of evaluating and improving service delivery and assuring quality of care.

Clinical Supervisor: The person designated to be responsible for the clinical supervision of the staff delivering clinical services in an AODA treatment program. This person is knowledgeable and experienced about the provision of substance abuse services, the change process and working with criminal offenders.

Co-facilitator: Person who assists with the facilitation of groups and is assisting a person who does meet the requirements and provides direct program services as part of a team.

Cognitive Interventions: Program which teaches specific strategies or techniques to enable offenders to

- (1) identify for themselves the specific thoughts that support their criminal behavior (self-observation);
- (2) see and appreciate the pattern and consequences of their thinking;
- (3) utilize reasoning and problem solving, self-talk, social interaction skills as a means of controlling and changing their thinking;
- (4) recognize that they have choices and can make a conscious decision to change or not to change.

The Department stresses programming that combines two types of cognitive interventions: cognitive restructuring (changing the thinking patterns, attitudes and beliefs that lead persons to offend) and cognitive skills training (teaching reasoning, problem solving and social skills).

COMPAS: Northpointe COMPAS is a single statewide DOC system of risk/needs assessment and case planning for an offender's lifecycle.

Community Service Order: Community service order refers to community service work required by the court as a condition of probation.

Community Service Work: Community service work refers to unpaid labor performed by offenders for non-profit organizations.

Containment Approach: Implementation strategies that depend on agency coordination and multidisciplinary partnerships, minimally between the agent, the treatment contractor and the polygrapher for sex offender programs.

Correctional Client: City, county, state, tribe or federal clients served in a correctional setting. The DOC will make sole determination of who meets this criterion.

Criminogenic Needs: Dynamic characteristics that a person presents that, if addressed, can reduce their likelihood of recidivism. Examples include: employment, substance use, anti-social personality, anti-social attitudes, anti-social associates, family dysfunction, poor self-control, and poor problem-solving skills.

Andrews, Bonta, and Hoge (1990:31) define criminogenic needs as a subset of risk factors consisting of dynamic attributes of offenders and their circumstances that, when changed, are associated with changes in the chances of recidivism.

- Anti-social cognition – Program targeting this specific criminogenic need seek to reduce anti-social cognition, recognize risky thinking, and feelings, and adopt an alternative identity.
- Anti-social companions – Programs targeting this specific criminogenic need seek to reduce association with offenders, enhance contact with pro-social companions.
- Anti-social personality or temperament – Programs targeting this specific criminogenic need seek to build problem solving, self-management, anger management, and coping skills.
- Family and/or marital – Programs targeting this specific criminogenic need seek to reduce conflict, build positive relationships and communication, and enhance monitoring/supervision.
- Substance Abuse – Programs targeting this specific criminogenic need seek to reduce usage, reduce the supports for abusive behavior, and enhance alternatives to abuse.
- Employment – Programs targeting this specific criminogenic need seek to provide employment seeking and keeping skills
- Education/Vocational – Programs targeting this specific criminogenic need seek to enhance performance rewards and satisfaction.
- Leisure/Recreation – Programs targeting this specific criminogenic need seek to enhance involvement and satisfaction in pro-social activities.

Criminogenic Risk Factors: Those features that research has demonstrated are related to criminal behavior. At least two types are recognized. *Static risk factors* are offender characteristics that cannot change but are predictive of an offender's propensity for future criminal activity, for example, the offender's age at the time of first offense. *Dynamic risk factors* are offender characteristics that may be altered by effective intervention. Examples of dynamic risk factors are substance abuse; identification with criminal companions; low tolerance for frustration; impulsivity; conflicts with authority; poor use of leisure time; conning and manipulation; thrill seeking; egocentrism; blaming others; dissatisfaction with conventional, mainstream activities; poor skills in identifying alternative choices; etc.

Culturally Diverse Programming: Programming which accommodates learning styles of offenders of African American, Hispanic, American Indian, Caucasian and other ethnic backgrounds. This is accomplished through diverse staff and program materials.

Day Report Center (DRC): A Day Report Center is a non-residential program which provides a variety of social services in a community setting.

Denial: The process through which an offender fails to accept responsibility for behavior. Denial can be seen on a continuum: deny the existence of the event (it didn't happen; the victim made it up); acknowledge the event, but deny any personal responsibility (I did it, but I was drunk, etc.); acknowledge the event, admit responsibility, but deny the significance of the event (I did it, it was wrong, but no harm was done). Offenders from all parts of this continuum could be referred to programming.

Direct Program Services: Tasks and responsibilities such as conducting sex offender assessments; providing individual and group treatment services; conducting program orientation, evaluation, aftercare, and support groups; case management activities including case planning, referral to other services, participation in staffings, maintenance of case records/files.

Domestic Abuse: A pattern of learned behaviors that could involve physical, sexual, economic, emotional and/or psychological abuse with an intimate. It affects people in all social

economic, racial, religious, and ethnic groups, whether they are married, divorced, living together, dating, or in a gay or lesbian relationship. There is no behavior on the part of the victim that causes or excuses the abuse. The batterer bears sole responsibility for his/her actions. Domestic abuse encompasses all of the following behaviors:

- Physical abuse includes a wide range of behaviors from restraint up to and including homicide. Physical abuse may also include coercing drug consumption or withholding medication;
- Sexual abuse is defined as anything from sexual activity pressed after a physically abusive incident to threats of infidelity, coerced sex acts, forcible intercourse, denial of contraception, coerced abortion, and sexual mutilation;
- Verbal and emotional abuse includes coercion and threats, verbal disparagement, intimidation, degrading or contemptuous behavior, withholding communication and yelling; may include denial, blame and making light of the abuse;
- Economic abuse occurs through direct or indirect manipulation or domination of family finances; the abdication of financial responsibility; sabotaging employment; housing or educational opportunities; disposition of the personal property of family members without consent;
- Psychological Abuse is a systematic breakdown of the partner's self-esteem to make them feel powerless. It can be expressed in several ways including but not limited to mind games, threats, etc. in order to control another person's thoughts and behaviors;
- Social isolation includes possessiveness or jealousy that results in the denial of communication or association with family, friends or contacts outside the home;
- Destruction of property includes vandalism of the home, car or other personal assets and may include arson;
- Threats or acts of abuse against children, significant others or family pets which encompass any of the above;
- Stalking, harassing and on-going monitoring of the victim.

Domestic Violence (DV): The concept that includes the entire spectrum of coercive control and battering exercised by a former or current intimate or dating partner over another (physical assaults, sexual assaults, emotional abuse, verbal abuse, isolation, economic abuse, threats, stalking and intimidation). Domestic violence is known as partner abuse, spouse abuse, intimate partner violence or battering, and can be characterized as a pattern of coercive behaviors that may include physical injury, progressive social isolation, deprivation, and intimidation.

Domestic Violence Education: A program whose curriculum educates participants on the definitions of abusive behavior, patterns and cycles of abuse, laws and statistics, societal attitudes, cultural differences, family values and beliefs, and legal consequences.

Domestic Violence Program Completion: Offender's compliance with standards, completion of requirements, and has shown quantifiable comprehension of program goals. It does not guarantee domestic violence has stopped during the program or in the future. Programs should not use terms like "graduation." This individual has met the minimum criteria of the program that should result in a lower risk for future violence if they choose to utilize the new learned skills and beliefs.

Evidence-Based Practices (EBP): Encompasses the principle of making decisions about how to provide care by integrating the best available evidence with practitioner expertise and other resources, and with the characteristics, state, needs, values, and preferences of those who will be affected. Using EBP implies that (1) there is a definable outcome(s); (2) that the outcome is measurable; and (3) it is defined according to practical realities.

Gender Specific: Programming designed specifically to address male and female offenders' needs and learning styles.

Guided Self-Discovery: This methodology proposes that to take a cognitive approach and then try to argue offenders out of their habits of thinking is ineffective and even counterproductive. Despite the fact that cognitive interventions involve learning new beliefs and behaviors, these are not taught through lectures or preaching. In guided discovery, questioning and exploration are

used to help participants discover what they think, guide them to pinpoint the source of their problems, assist them in seeing new perspectives, and help them find their own solutions to their problems. When using guided discovery, facilitators model a process that offenders can use, on their own, to explore, evaluate and challenge their beliefs and thoughts rather than continually relying upon facilitators to pinpoint the sources of their problems and find solutions for them. Asking questions also helps the facilitator keep track of a participant's progress in understanding cognitive concepts and making cognitive changes.

The guided discovery approach is also used to maximize participant involvement in the group sessions. When responding to questions, the participant is doing most of the work rather than being a passive recipient listening to statements from the facilitator. Guiding participants to pinpoint the source of their problems and find their own solutions also minimizes the possibility of the participant believing that the facilitator is attempting to impose his or her own ideas on the participant. Participants often adopt new perspectives more readily when they are allowed to form their own conclusions than when they are persuaded to adopt the facilitator's conclusions. This methodology tends to increase feelings of self-efficacy and empowerment in participants by encouraging them to adopt an internal focus of evaluation.

The facilitator's role is to work with participants to help them recognize their cognitions and other risk factors that cause problems for them; to test the validity of the thoughts, beliefs and assumptions that prove important; and to make changes in both cognition and behaviors. By actively collaborating with the offender, facilitators minimize the resistance and opposition that is often elicited by taking an authoritarian role, yet they still remain in a position to structure each session and the overall course of the program in a way that is as efficient and effective as possible.

Healing Circles: Culturally specific programming designed to act as a guide/mentor to tribal members. The Healing Circle may include, but is not limited to, the following: Sharing of cultural knowledge and cultural mores, assisting offender in obtaining or reaching those cultural goals they aspire to complete; provide wrap-around services to assist in education, employment search, healthy lifestyles, AODA services, parenting/education, victim impact, and assistance in finding and/or maintaining housing.

High profile/high risk (HP/HR) offender: An offender whose case management includes issues arising from media attention, offender notoriety, or community opposition. They are often cases with an assaultive history, have mental health problems or convictions for sex offenses. Some of these sex offenders may be sentenced under statutes that require sex offender special bulletin notice (SBN) and/or sex offender registration with the DOC.

Impulse Control: This means programming that will address behavior modification as it concerns the inability to resist impulses that result in a harmful action to one's self or others.

Intake Assessment: The process by which a counselor or service contractor reviews and evaluates offender history to include such data as the AODA assessment, Criminal Complaint, Judgment of Conviction, Agent's Assessment and Impressions, and offender interview to determine and report appropriateness and level of group services to be provided.

Minimization: An offender admits to offense or main elements of offense but does not fully acknowledge significant factors, e.g., their responsibility for the offense, attributes responsibility to the victim, shortens period of time or frequency of offenses, diminishes degree of force, denies impact on victim, denies sexualized intent, admits knowing victim was underage but denies knowing victim as young as she/he was.

Offender: For purposes of this solicitation, the term "offender" is defined as an individual convicted in adult court and/or with a history of criminal or deviant sexual behavior and under the supervision of the DOC, DCC. A person whose history includes a sexual assault conviction, commitment, or read-in, or whose history includes any offense, commitment, juvenile adjudication, or read-in which involved behaviors that were sexually motivated or deviant.

Polygraph: An instrument that records continuously, visually, permanently, and simultaneously any changes in cardiovascular, respiratory, and dermal patterns as minimum instrumentation

standards, and is used, or the results of which are used, for the purpose of detecting deception or verifying truth of statements made by an examinee.

Program Participant: Program participant is defined as an offender referred by DCC and receiving services through the Sex Offender Program.

Program Evaluation: The identification of quantifiable behavioral indicators of response to the planned intervention used to determine program efficacy through reduction in recidivism.

Program Statement: The written statement of a program's philosophy and model of treatment; the research basis for selection of the treatment model; the problem and the population to be served; the goals, objectives, and activities to be employed to achieve the desired outcomes; and the plan for determining the efficacy of the services provided.

Protected Health Information (PHI): Individually identifiable health information in any form or medium, including demographic information, created, received, maintained, or transmitted by the Contractor, on behalf of the DOC, where such information relates to the past, present, or future physical or mental health or condition of an individual, the provision of health care to an individual, or the payment for the provision of health care to an individual, and where such information identifies the individual or provides a reasonable basis to believe that it can be used to identify an individual.

PHI excludes individually identifiable health information in education records covered by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and employment records held by the Department in its role as employer.

Punishers: Involves the application of a stimulus to decrease behavior.

Reactive or Affective Aggression: Aggression that is caused by unpleasant affects (anxiety, anger, frustration, etc.) triggered by a situational stimulus. Aggressor perceives that victim provoked violence. Often violence is impulsive with very little planning by aggressor. Harm to victim is the primary goal.

Reinforcers: Involves the application of a stimulus to increase behavior.

Relapse Profile: A profile of those factors in the offender's milieu and lifestyle, behavior, thinking, beliefs, attitudes, arousal, and fantasy, which predispose and move the offender toward criminal sexual behavior.

Responsivity: Refers to the learning style and characteristics of the offender which can affect their engagement in treatment.

Screening: The process which identifies whether an offender has an AODA problem (in this case) and if so, a recommendation for the most appropriate type of treatment. A screening is a "first cut" done quickly, without the detailed, in-depth, current information that would be gathered for an assessment. A screening should not be confused with an assessment, which is a lengthier, much more definitive process.

Secular Programming: Programming that is free of religious components –Administrative Directive 01-10 (Appendix 1).

Sexually Violent Person Law (SVP): Refers to Chapter 980 of the Wisconsin Statutes. This law creates a process for the indefinite civil commitment, for treatment purposes, of persons previously convicted, adjudicated, or committed for certain sexually violent or sexually motivated offenses.

Social Skills Training (SST): Social skills training (SST) is a form of behavior therapy used by therapists and trainers to help persons who have difficulties relating to other people. A major goal of SST is teaching persons who may have emotional problems about the verbal as well as nonverbal behaviors involved in social interactions. There are people who have never been taught such interpersonal skills as making "small talk" in social settings, or the importance of

good eye contact during a conversation. In addition, many people have not learned to "read" the many subtle cues contained in social interactions, such as how to tell when someone wants to change the topic of conversation or shift to another activity. SST helps people learn to interpret these and other social signals, so that they can determine how to act appropriately in the company of other people in a variety of different situations. SST proceeds on the assumption that when people improve their social skills or change selected behaviors, they will raise their self-esteem and increase the likelihood that others will respond favorably to them. People learn to change their social behavior patterns by practicing selected behaviors in individual or **group therapy** sessions. Another goal of SST is improving a person's ability to function in everyday social situations.

Special Bulletin Notification (SBN): The release of a sex offender's information pursuant of the 1995 Wisconsin Statute 301.46(2m), which authorizes the DOC to inform law enforcement agencies of the release of a convicted sex offender when the release of information will enhance public safety and protection.

Special Populations: Offenders that may present particular characteristics such as the following - cognitively challenged (low functioning), non-English speaking, learning challenged, mentally ill or physically challenged (hearing/visual/mobility impaired).

Staffings: Verbal communication and information shared by DOC staff and contractor about a specific offender which usually involves a face-to-face meeting, but may take place over the telephone. The offender may or may not be present at the meeting or time of telephone call.

Treatment: A comprehensive set of planned and organized therapeutic experiences and interventions which are researched based intended to improve the prognosis, function, and outcome of offenders to reduce their risk of sexual re-offense or other sexually abusive and other aggressive behavior.

Type I Housing Unit: A one-(1) or two-(2) bedroom furnished apartment, which has a bathroom, common living area and a kitchen with an operating refrigerator and stove. The number of occupants per bedroom shall not exceed one (1) and the total occupancy per unit shall not exceed two (2) individuals of the same gender. The unit must meet all applicable state and local codes, regulations, and requirements.

Type II Housing Unit: A furnished facility that can accommodate multiple same gender residents in single or double occupancy bedrooms, with access to a congregate living area and a shared kitchen. The living room and the kitchen must be designed to accommodate the needs of multiple occupants. The unit must meet all applicable state and local codes, regulations, and requirements. Additionally, the facility must be a single purpose program.


Urinalysis (UA): Analysis of urine, used to detect the presence of a specific substance, such as an illegal drug.
