


## Mental Health

94% of Female Youth at Copper Lake have a mental health condition\*. Of the total female population, 61% have a serious condition.

78% of Male Youth at Lincoln Hills have a mental health condition\*. Of the total male population, 29% have a serious condition.

\*e.g. personality disorder, severe depression


## Population Trends
