


Mental Health

92% of Female Youth at Copper Lake have a mental health condition*. Of the total female population, 75% have a serious condition.

78% of Male Youth at Lincoln Hills have a mental health condition*. Of the total male population, 28% have a serious condition.

*e.g. personality disorder, severe depression


Population Trends
