


Community numbers represent youth supervised by a DJC State Agent who are not residing in a state juvenile facility.





#### Commitment Types\*




#### Dual Commitments\*\*

\*Youth can have multiple commitments at the same time. Commitment Type data represents all commitments held by youth under DJC's care.



## Facility Commitments by County





#### Administrative Confinement Placements



#### Avg. Hours in Administrative Confinement




### Physical Interaction\*
