

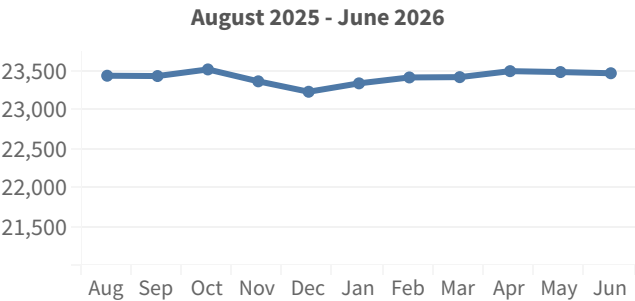

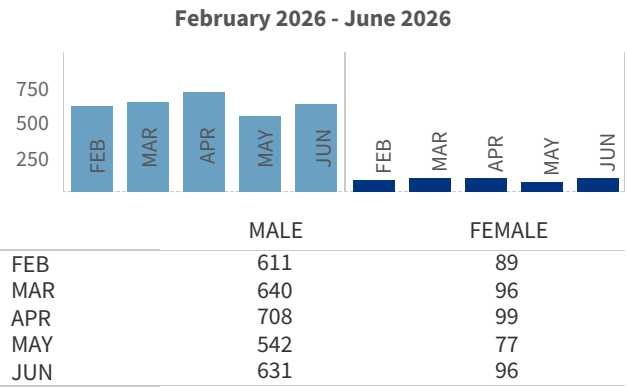

MONTHLY PRISON POPULATION TREND



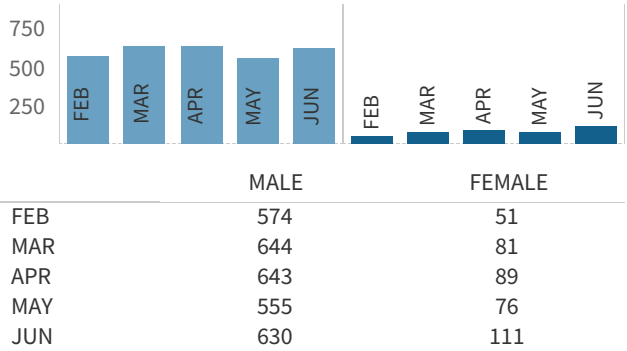
