


Mental Health

89% of Female Youth at Copper Lake have a mental health condition*. Of the total female population, 79% have a serious condition.

83% of Male Youth at Lincoln Hills have a mental health condition*. Of the total male population, 24% have a serious condition.

*e.g. personality disorder, severe depression


Population Trends
