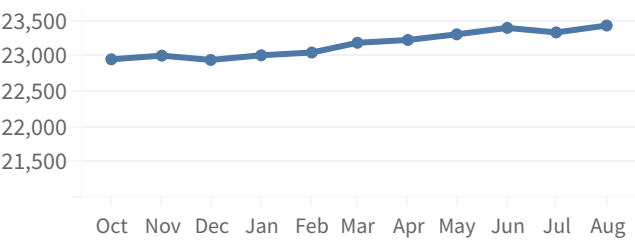

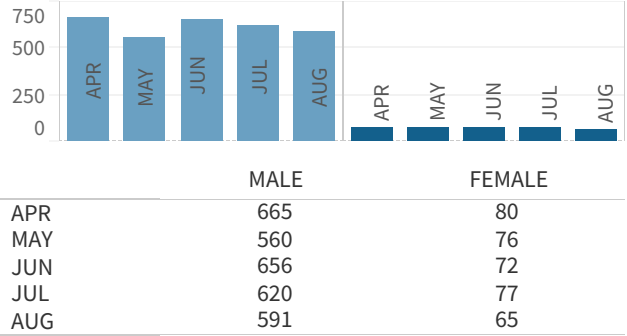
MONTHLY PRISON POPULATION TREND

ADMISSIONS TO PRISON

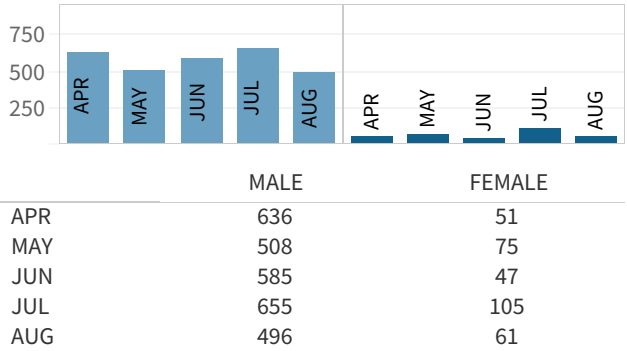
April 2025 - August 2025
