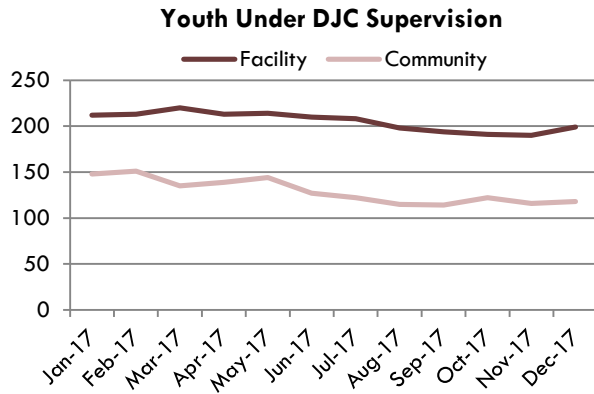


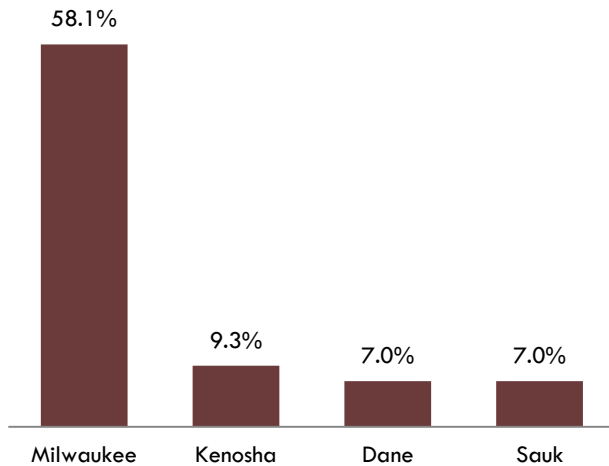
Population Trends

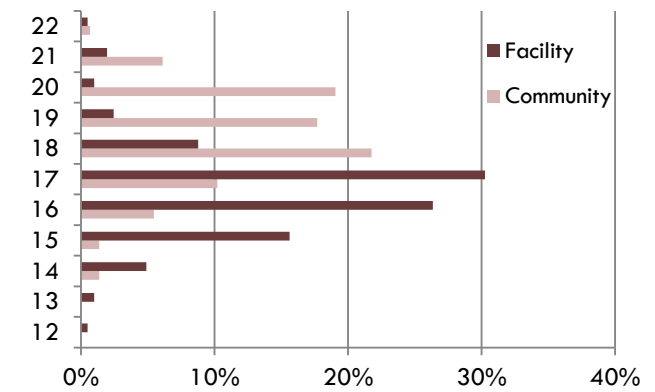

Race of Youth Supervised by DJC

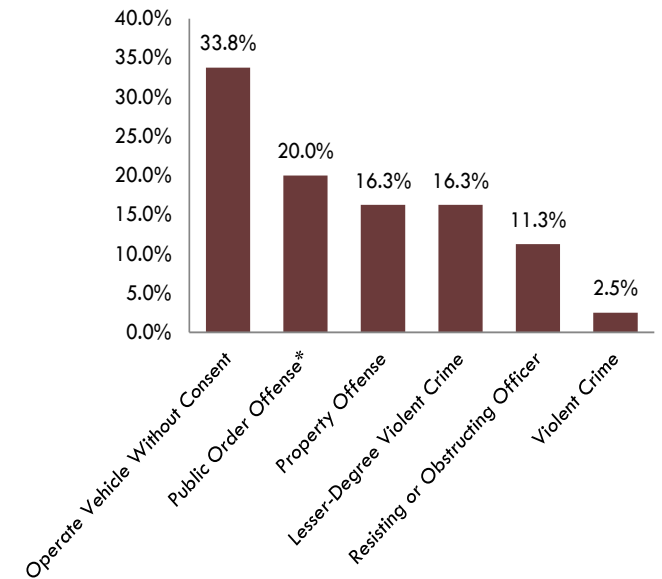
