

## **Early Parole Discharges (May 13, 2021-September 26, 2022)**

Under s. 301.03(16), Stats., at the request of the legislature, the Wisconsin Department of Corrections (WI DOC) must submit to the legislature under s. 13.172 (2) a report that includes the following information and post the report on the department's website:

- (a) If, since the previous report was submitted or during a date range specified in the request, an individual was pardoned for a crime or was released from a term of imprisonment without completing his or her sentence, the name of the individual, the pertinent crime, and the name of the person who authorized the action.
- (b) If an individual who appears on a report submitted under this subsection is convicted of a crime, the name of that individual and the crime for which he or she was convicted.

Currently, individuals who were discharged early from parole by the WI DOC under s. 302.11(6) are the only individuals who meet the criteria laid out in this statute, as under the current Governor's criteria for pardons, no individual is eligible to be considered for pardon until more than five years after having completed their sentence and any associated supervision.

As requested, the following list includes individuals who received an early discharge from parole between May 13, 2021, and September 26, 2022. Each offense that the individual received an early discharge for is listed (multiple counts of the same offense type are only listed once). Additionally, for those offenses, the earliest sentencing date was included.

Records found on the Wisconsin Consolidated Court Automation Programs (CCAP) website were used to determine if an individual had received a criminal conviction in Wisconsin after early discharge. Sometimes individuals remain on supervision after receiving their early parole discharges due to consecutive probation cases or concurrent Truth in Sentencing cases. This is noted in the column labeled "Remains Under DOC Supervision."

Please note that this is a point-in-time report. Meaning that data points related to "Criminal Convictions After Discharge" were pulled as of September 26, 2022, and data points related to "Remains Under DOC Supervision" were pulled as of September 26, 2022, and it may have changed since the submission of this report.
