VISITING REGULATIONS

Visiting Hours:

Fridays:

6:00pm to 9:00pm

Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays

8:30am to 11:30am

12:30pm to 3:30pm

All visitors must be on the inmates approved "Visiting List" with proper I.D. (State driver's license, State picture ID, passport, military ID)

All In Person Visits must be scheduled through www.icsolutions.com. Only 1 visiting block is allowed per weekend. (Weekend consist of Friday, Saturday, Sunday, Holiday if applicable)

All visitors must proceed from the Visitors Parking Area to the Control Center to register. Once registered, visitors are not allowed to return to their vehicles unless authorized by the sergeant. The sergeant MUST inspect all items brought into the Center. The Sergeants will have discretion over any items brought during visits. All visitors will need to comply with their directives.

Visiting Regulations:

- You are not permitted to pass or receive items during a visit.
- No animals are allowed on visits.
- You will be allowed only to embrace and kiss your visitors at the beginning and end of the visit. All other physical contact through the remainder of the visit is prohibited.
- Inmates are required to sit directly across the table from their wife, girlfriend, fiancé or significant other.
- Inmates and visitors must keep both hands above the table at all times.
- Visitors leaving the visiting area are not allowed to re-enter the building on that given day.
- You are not allowed to go back to your room.
- Visitors - No personal property (including cell phones, pagers, PDA's, any electronic device or cameras) is allowed in the center except for baby supplies and a maximum of \$25 per person (for the vending machines).

- Parents are responsible for supervising their children during visits. If you have children or your family brings children, YOU are required to keep the children under control at all times. If staff feels that you are not keeping minor children under control, your visit will be terminated and/or those children may be temporarily suspended from visiting.
- An adult must accompany any visitor under the age of 18.
- Visiting with another inmate's visitor is not allowed.
- Visitors are required to use the designated bathroom facilities. Inmates are not to enter those bathrooms for any reason. Inmates are to use the designated inmate bathrooms with permission of staff.
- You are not permitted to pass or receive items during a visit without authorization from staff. No money orders or certified checks for inmates may be brought in. No property items are allowed to be brought in on visits.
- Visitors are not allowed to bring in smoking/vaping materials.
- The use of offensive, loud, or vulgar language will result in the termination of your visit.
- Purses and diaper bags are not permitted inside the center. Diapers, individual wipes, and plastic baby bottles should be carried in a paper or plastic bag.
- No blankets are allowed, except a small blanket for a baby. If you need a towel to place on the picnic table benches, please ask for one.
- No food or beverages are allowed to be brought into the Center. Any items purchased thru the vending machines must be consumed by the end of the visit.

Introducing Contraband to an Inmate or Correctional Setting is a Felony

Wisconsin Statute 302.095 Delivering Articles to Inmate

- (a) Any officer or other person who does any of the following contrary to the rules or regulations and without the knowledge or permission of the sheriff or other keeper of the jail, in the case of a jail, or the warden or superintendent of the prison, in the case of a prison, is guilty of a Class I felony:
1. Delivers, procures to be delivered, or has in his or her possession with intent to deliver to any inmate confined in a jail or state prison, any article or thing whatever, with intent that any inmate confined in the jail or prison shall obtain or receive the same.
 2. Deposits or conceals in or about a jail or prison, or the precincts of a jail or prison, or in any vehicle going into the premises belonging to a jail or prison, any article or thing whatever, with intent that any inmate confined in the jail or prison shall obtain or receive the same.
 3. Receives from any inmate any article or thing whatever with intent to convey the same out of a jail or prison.
- (b) Any person who, contrary to the rules or regulations and without the knowledge or permission of the sheriff or other keeper of the jail, in the case of a jail, or the warden or superintendent of the prison, in the case of a prison, has in his or her possession with intent to retain for himself or herself any article or thing whatever, is guilty of a Class I felony.
