Health Assessment – Assessment of an individual's health status that provides the initial database for health care to be recommended during incarceration. Health assessment provides essential information for the diagnosis of health conditions that are preventable or treatable and continuity of care for chronic health conditions.

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New Admission – Has not had an assessment within the Wisconsin Department of Corrections greater than 12 months.

Significant Medical Condition – Patients including, but not limited to, those who are known to have conditions such as diabetes, cardiac disease, seizure disorders, asthma and end stage liver disease, those with cancer or immunosuppression, dialysis patients, and those who have had recent hospitalization admissions or surgery.

WICS – Wisconsin Integrated Computer System

PROCEDURE

I. General Guidelines

- A. All patients shall receive an initial health assessment as soon as possible but no later than 7 days of admission to the DOC.
- B. Patients with acute illness or clinically significant health needs shall have their initial health assessment as soon as possible.

II. Health Assessment and Plan of Care

- A. The initial health assessment shall include, but is not limited to:
 1. Review of the health history including the DOC-2077 – Health Transfer Summary and the review of receiving screening results Review of the height, weight and vital signs by a healthcare professional.
 2. Collection of additional information to complete the medical, dental, and mental health histories taken during the receiving screening and any subsequent encounters.
 3. Review diagnostic labs and tests including those for screening of communicable diseases and order additional tests and immunizations as needed. All abnormal findings are (i.e., history and physical, screening, and laboratory) are reviewed by a provider.
- B. A physical examination (as indicated by the patient's gender, age, and risk factors) performed by an ACP. The PAP can be omitted if there is documentation the patient is a short-term admission (less than 6 months) such as an ATR.
- C. Specific problems are integrated into an initial problem list.
- D. The diagnostic and therapeutic plan of care shall be documented for each problem identified as clinically indicated.
- E. The ACP shall complete a Medical Classification for housing, work, activity, or activity restrictions and any identified medical contraindications.
- F. The Medical Classification shall be entered into WICS.
- G. All orders for further diagnostic evaluations, referrals, and/or treatment for specific health conditions shall be discussed with the patient.

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- H. Education regarding prescribed medications shall be completed and documented.
- I. Patients with diagnosed chronic conditions or medical conditions requiring continued care shall be scheduled for follow-up care. See DAI 500.30.55.

III. Optometry Screening

- A. An optometry screening shall be completed by trained HSU staff and documented.
- B. A referral to optical shall be completed for refractory concerns not corrected by the patient's current corrective lenses and anyone with contact lenses based on DAI 500.30.35.

IV. Oral Screening and Examination follow DAI Policy 500.40.06.

V. Mental Health Screening and Examination follow DAI Policy 500.70.01.

VI. Readmissions

- A. Review previous health care record.
- B. The patient's health status shall be reviewed and updated with new information as noted in II. Above.
