# **POLICY**

The Division of Adult Institutions shall ensure discussion of patient information and clinical encounters are conducted in private and carried out in a manner designed to encourage the patient's subsequent use of health services.

## **DEFINITIONS, ACRONYMS AND FORMS**

<u>Clinical encounters</u> – Interactions between patients and health care professionals that involve a treatment and/or an exchange of confidential information.

#### **PROCEDURES**

#### General Guidelines

- A. Discussions regarding patient care shall occur in private, without being overheard by other and non-health staff.
- B. Clinical encounters shall occur in private, without being observed or overheard.
- C. Security staff shall be present only if the patient poses a probable risk to the safety of the health care professional or others.
- D. Instruction on maintaining confidentiality is given to security staff and interpreters who observe or hear health encounters.
- E. When triaging health complaints at cell side, health care staff shall take extra precautions to promote private communication between health staff and patients; such as speaking in a soft voice, discussing the minimum necessary protected health information necessary for triaging, and asking officers to move away from the cell front if safety can be provided.
- F. When safety is a concern and full privacy is lacking, alternative strategies for partial visual or partial auditory privacy shall be considered.

## **FACILITY PROCEDURE**

- On Unit 25, privacy (e.g., privacy screen, curtain, etc.) shall be utilized during physical exams, with special considerations for pelvic, rectal, breast and other genital exams.
  - A. Inmate patient privacy shall be protected:
    - 1. Between patients sharing rooms.
    - 2. From Security staff working on the unit unless it is a minimum necessary or need to know medical information.
    - 3. From inmate workers within the unit.
  - B. Security staff shall ensure the inmate patient can be seen through the privacy curtain mesh for safety.

## II. Privacy curtains shall:

- A. Be used to protect patient health information during cell side visits between patient beds.
- B. Be used to protect patient health information from hallway traffic during cell side visits or utilizing the toilet.
- C. Be controlled by medical or security staff.
- D. Not be opened or closed by inmate patients.
- E. Allow Security staff to see the inmate patient through the privacy curtain mesh for safety.
