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



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
Committee Decision

Motion re: Collective Ranking

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
Ranking Process Overview

- 1. All members get an equal # of votes
- 2. Collective ranking = sum of individual member votes for each recommendation
- 3. Recommendations will be ranked <u>within</u> their topic area, not across topic areas
- 4. Higher individual priorities will have greater weight in the final rankings
- 5. Each committee member gets 12 color-coded and numbered ranking dots (3 dots x 4 topic areas)
 - Blue = Education and Employment
 - Yellow = Rehabilitative/Treatment Services
 - Green = Family and Community Engagement
 - Red = Developmental/Recreational Programming

Color of the dots denotes the topic area

Ranking Process...

- Each member gets 12 dots; **Color** denotes topic area
- # on the dots denotes individual priority



Steps:

- 1. Select a topic area
- 2. Identify your top 3 priority recommendations within that topic
- 3. Place your dots in the box next to your chosen recommendations
 - Place dot with #1 for the highest priority
 - Place dot with #2 for the 2nd highest priority
 - Place dot with #3 for the 3rd highest priority

Only one dot per recommendation within each topic area



Color denotes topic area; **#** denotes individual priority

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Scoring of Recommendations

All recommendations are scored <u>within</u> each topic area, not across topics.

- Each dot with #1 (highest priority) = 3 points
- Each dot with #2 (2nd highest priority) = 2 points
- Each dot with #3 (3rd highest priority) = 1 point
 - This allows individual members to show their priorities, and the calculation of weighted total for each recommendation.

Example: If a recommendation receives 15 dots:

4 dots with "#1" 1 5 dots with "#2" (2)2 2 2 2 6 dots with "#3" (3) 3 3 3 3 3 Then its score = (4 dots*3) + (5 dots*2) + (6 dots*1) = 12+10+6 = 28 points Review scoring results
