Considerations for a Grant Rubric

Per the grant announcement, grant responses will be scored "according to the application requirements and in accordance with the Wisconsin model of youth justice."

Selection criteria, as noted in the grant announcement:

- 1. Budget Detail/Narrative/Cash Match
- 2. Facility/Geographical Information
- 3. Assessment of Resources/Programming
- 4. Project Narrative and main summary
- 5. Implementation Plan
- 6. Program Sustainability
- 7. Evidence of local support

Questions for consideration:

- Should we have a qualitative or a quantitative rubric?
- For a quantitative rubric, how many points should each section be rewarded?
- How should the application requirements be weighed in comparison to the Wisconsin model?
- Are there any other factors we would want to include for scoring?
